Injury Deaths (2000-2011)

Descriptive Notes:

- Homicide rates were similar between 2000 and 2007.
- Suicide rates increased from 2000-2003 to 2004-2007 then decreased in 2008-2011.
- Unintentional injury death rates steadily increased from 2000 to 2011.
- (*) Interpret with caution because rates were based on less than 20 deaths.

Descriptive Notes:

- Assault hospitalization rates increased from 2002-2005 to 2006-2009 and remained similar in 2010.
- Self-harm hospitalization rates were similar in 2002 and 2003 then increased in 2004 and were similar between 2004 and 2011.
- Unintentional injury hospitalization rates were similar between 2002 and 2011.

Descriptive Notes:

- Assault ED visit rates increased from 2002 to 2003 then fluctuated without a consistent pattern between 2003 and 2011.
- Self-harm ED visit rates were similar between 2002 and 2005 then decreased in 2006 remained lower through 2011.
- Unintentional injury ED visit rates decreased from 2003 to 2004 then remained similar between 2004 and 2011.



Injury Cost Estimates for Wood County:


- Fatal and non-fatal injuries cost* \$171 million in medical care and work loss in 2011.
- Injuries cost on average \$1,355 per Wood County resident in 2011.

*Costs are reported in 2005 U.S. dollars and based on national estimates for average cost of injury deaths, hospitalizations, and ED visits developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Rates per 100,000




Descriptive Notes:

- Motor vehicle traffic crashes, falls, poisoning, and suicide were the leading causes of injury death among Wood County residents.
- Motor vehicle traffic crash, and falls death rates among Wood County residents were higher than the state average.
- Poisoning death and suicide rates among Wood County residents were lower than the state average.

Rates per 100,000




Descriptive Notes:

- Falls, motor vehicle traffic crashes, self-harm, and poisoning were the leading causes of injury hospitalizations among Wood County residents.
- Hospitalization rates resulting from falls and motor vehicle accidents among Wood County residents were higher than the state average.
- Hospitalization rates resulting from self-harm and poisoning, among Wood County residents were lower than the state average.

Injury Emergency Department Visits (2011)

Injury Emergency Department Visits (Five Leading Causes)
Rates per 100,000



Descriptive Notes:

- Falls, being struck, overexertion, motor vehicle traffic crashes, and cuts or pierces were the leading causes of injury ED visits among Wood County residents.
- ED visit rates resulting from motor vehicle traffic crashes among Wood County residents were lower than the state average.
- ED visit rates resulting from falls, being struck, overexertion, and cuts or pierces among Wood County residents were similar to the state average.



Every week in Wood County:

- 1 person dies from an injury.
- 13 hospitalizations are caused by an injury.
- 240 ED visits are caused by an injury.

Technical Notes


- Mechanisms noted with an (*) are unintentional injuries.

- (+) Rates suppressed due to counts of less than 20.
- All rates on pages 1, 2, and 4 are age adjusted to the 2000 U.S. standard population.

Drug Poisoning


Drug Poisoning Deaths (2008-2011)



Descriptive Notes:

- 39 Wood County residents died from unintentional drug poisoning in 2008-2011.
- Unintentional drug poisoning death rate among Wood County residents was lower than the state average.


Drug Poisoning Hospitalizations (2011)



Descriptive Notes:

- 22 hospitalizations resulted from unintentional drug poisoning among Wood County residents in 2011.
- Unintentional drug poisoning hospitalization rate among Wood County residents was lower than the state average.

Drug Poisoning Emergency Department Visits (2011)



Descriptive Notes:

- 61 ED visits resulted from unintentional drug poisoning among Wood County residents in 2011.
- Unintentional drug poisoning ED visit rate among Wood County residents was lower than the state average.



In Wood County:

- 1 person dies every month from an unintentional drug poisoning.
- 2 hospitalizations are caused every month by an unintentional drug poisoning.
- 4 ED visits are caused every month by an unintentional drug poisoning.
