### OIPP Leadership Team Update: Nicole Hodges

- Bylaws have been reviewed and some amendments have been made the membership will have the opportunity to vote on them at the annual meeting.
- The Strategic Plan will be reviewed through now and August.
- The application has been updated to reflect the changes in infrastructure and streamlining some questions.
- The Mentoring Program will be completing their mid-year surveys in June any questions contact Pam Rudolph.

### Violence and Injury Prevention Program (VIPP) Update: Jolene Defiore-Hyrmer

- **Organizational Update-** The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) is currently in an organizational process. The work completed by VIPP will continue and will be located in the Bureau of Health Promotion. We continue to work on filling vacancies within the program.
- **Grant Opportunities-** VIPP recently completed the continuation application for current Core Grant Funding for injury. VIPP also submitted a grant for Prescription Drug Overdose (PDO) to improve the automated prescription system (OARRS) in terms of access, usage, and monitoring. This opportunity will also focus on the prescribing guidelines and target the high risk counties within the state for PDO.
- **Funding-** The Federal budget continued the PHHSBG and identified additional funding to focus on prescription drug overdose at a state and local level.
- **Injury Priorities-** VIPP has submitted request for proposals (RFP) to the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) for partners to assist with our injury priorities. RFP's include implementation of the Stopping Elderly Accidents, Deaths, and Injuries (STEADI) Tool Kit into health care practices and a contract was awarded to RAMA Consulting Group in partnership with Ohio Health. This pilot will give

ODH and OIPP an opportunity to identify best practices, lessons learned, and integration of falls assessment into the electronic record.

- **Partnerships**-The Trauma Committee works with several partners with a trauma system framework. In this plan many of the goals of the OIPP have been adopted. The injury portion of the assessment has greatly increased in capacity since the inception of the plan. This committee is an excellent opportunity for engagement with Injury Prevention and the Trauma Systems.

## **Action Group Updates**

### ***Infrastructure-Level Groups***

#### **Data Action Group (DAG)-Mbabazi Kariisa**

- The Data Action Group met in March at the Ohio Department of Public Safety. Twelve people were in attendance, representing: Ohio Hospital Association, Ohio Department of Health, EMS, OCJS, Nationwide Children's Hospital, and Mental Health and Addiction Services. Presentations were given by the Ohio Hospital Association on hospital discharge data, and by Mental Health and Addiction Services on the Multi-Agency Community Services Information Systems (MACSIS).
- Our next meeting will be held on Thursday, June 18, from 1-2:30 at the Ohio Department of Public Safety. Presenters will be: Dr. Kenny Steinman, discussing data from the Ohio Family Violence Prevention Project and researcher Kristina Nicholson will discuss data from the Ohio Statewide Citizen Attitude Survey regarding community-police relations.

#### **Professional Development and Capacity Building Group (PROCAP)-Pam Rudolph**

- After the member survey and leadership team meeting it was determined the focus of the EBIPAG will be shifted to professional development and capacity building for injury prevention efforts statewide.
- This will allow the group to have the following subcommittees: Professional Development, Member Communications, and Member Outreach.
- Today the action group will determine strategic planning per subcommittee. The plans will align with the other action groups.
- Membership update: 20 members did not review from the previous year; 40 members have joined since the February meeting; 6 members have asked to be removed from the OIPP. We have had a net gain of 14 members.

#### **Injury Prevention Policy and Advocacy Action Group (IPPAAG)-Sara Morman**

- The Ohio Injury Prevention Partnership (OIPP) Policy and Advocacy Action Group (IPPAAG) offered the Power Prism Webinar series with Diane Pickles from M+R Strategic Services. Power Prism is a step-by-step advocacy framework for recognizing and acting on opportunities to build momentum in an advocacy campaign. Power Prism is built on six advocacy tools – this webinar series focused on three of the six tools as follows: Grassroots & Key Contacts, Fundraising & Development, and Decision Maker Advocacy.
- IPPAAG will also host an in person Advocacy Workshop on June 26, 2015 which will cover the remaining Power Prism tools with Research and Data, Media Advocacy and use, and Coalition Building and Maintenance. - The Ohio Injury Prevention Partnership (OIPP), coordinated by the Ohio Department of Health's Violence and Injury Prevention Program, is concerned with building Ohio's capacity to address the prevention of injury. As part of OIPP's prevention efforts, we strive to educate decision makers and the

public about the impact that injury has on the lives of Ohioans as well as what can be done to prevent injuries.

### ***Priority Injury Action Groups Annual Reports***

#### **Prescription Drug Abuse Action Group (PDAAG)-Judi Mosley**

- Conducted an online survey of PDAAG members in January. The results will be posted to the OIPP website. In general there was a very positive response as to the value of PDAAG and identified the role of PDAAG as:
  - Networking and information and resource sharing;
  - Making policy recommendations to decision makers; and,
  - Promoting policy, systems and environmental change.
- Held a strategic planning session during the February PDAAG meeting to identify priorities for 2015 and 2016. Two priority areas were chosen through discussion and consensus:
  - Harm Reduction – three objectives:
    - Promote the dispensing of naloxone by pharmacists without a doctor's prescription;
    - Promote Project DAWN and other harm reduction programs (e.g. Good Samaritan law) for implementation across the state and,
    - Promote proper drug disposal: permanent drug drop boxes, drug take back events, etc.
  - Education of Health Care Providers – four objectives:
    - Promote the use of the opioid prescribing guidelines and OARRS;
    - Identify venues for education of health care providers/prescribers on the use of the opioid prescribing guidelines and OARRS;

- Identify, catalog and promote “easy” tools already available for education about appropriate opioid prescribing and substance abuse; and,
- Promote education about substance abuse and proper prescribing in professional schools and residency programs.
- A conference call took place in March for each committee to identify action steps and the committees will continue to work on action steps to achieve the priorities in today’s meeting.
- Also today, speakers will focus on
  - Using data from a Poison Death Review committee to identify interventions.
  - Engaging partners for prevention of PDA.
- Project DAWN: Increases to grow: 18 counties/21 programs- community based; 7 hospital/treatment based; 6 state psychiatric hospitals.
- VIPP submitted a grant to CDC – If funded, 4 years at \$1 million a year – Focused on systems change:
  - Enhance OARRS
  - Support community interventions to promote prescribing guidelines and OARRS
  - Evaluate effect of legislation HB 341(mandatory use of OARRS) and HB4
- Legislative Update:
  - House Bill 4 – delayed due to the state budget negotiations.
  - Would permit the dispensing of naloxone by pharmacists or pharmacy intern without a doctor’s prescription.
  - Legislature is usually on break at the end of June so HB 4 may not be taken up again until the fall.
  - 911 Good Samaritan Law – Not yet introduced as a separate bill; was proposed as an amendment to HB 4 – but still under discussion/negotiation.

## Ohio Older Adult Falls Prevention Coalition-Brenda Rock

- The Older Adult Falls Prevention Coalition of the Ohio Injury Prevention Partnership is excited to announce the mini grant projects that will be funded in 2015. These projects were selected through a competitive application process. Each project will be provided a grant to initiate policy, environmental, or systems change related to older adult fall prevention in their community. By providing these grant dollars to diverse communities and organizations, the Coalition will help spread awareness and increase opportunities for older adults to become actively engaged in evidence-based fall prevention strategies across Ohio.

The symposium will take place November 6, 2015 at the Crowne Plaza North in Worthington and will focus on multi-disciplinary strategies used to prevent older adult falls to include: mobility/exercise, health care, and home environment.
