Action Group Updates

- **Child Injury Action Group (CIAG)** – Amanda updated the group on the CIAG's projects. All priority areas in the CIAG (with the exception of Bike Safety) met concerning direction and activities. Planning meetings with the EBIPAG were held to discuss the Principles of Injury Workshop scheduled for November 7th. The CIAG has contracted with The Center for Health Outcomes Policy & Evaluation Studies (HOPES) at The Ohio State University College of Public Health for an evaluation of the coalition and assistance with updating the action groups within the CIAG. There will be a day long strategic planning meeting the week of October 20th and HOPES will be present at the November 14th meeting of the CIAG. Four mini-grants were awarded to Promedica Children's Hospital for Infant Safe Sleep (ISS), the University of Dayton for Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Hocking County Help me grow for ISS, and to the Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics for ISS.
- **Ohio Older Adults Falls Prevention Coalition** – Brenda Rock updated on the Falls Coalition. The coalition funded the following mini-grants: Grant Medical Center – Trauma Services for training two master trainers for Stepping On, Genesis HealthCare System- Trauma Services for a master trainer for Matter of Balance (MOB), Lorain County General Health District for implementing the STEADI tool kit, Area Agency on Aging 11, Inc. to expand access to MOB, Area Office On Aging of Northwestern Ohio, Inc. to expand access to MOB/Tai Chi, Center for Integrative Health and Wellness, The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center for training coaches in Taiji, Mount Carmel Trauma Services, Mount Carmel Health System for training coaches for Tai Chi. The grants are throughout Ohio and will meet objectives of the State Plan to build the infrastructure for Tai Chi. The Coalition is working with the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) and the Ohio Department of Aging (ODA) to prepare a virtual tool kit for National Falls Prevention Awareness Day on September 23rd. The Promotion and Awareness Committee is meeting on Friday August 15th to prepare for state wide conference on fall prevention for September of 2015. The policy is reviewing legislation for a tax credit for home medication for fall prevention and establishing funding in the State budget for fall prevention. Katherine Hayes is working with ODH, ODA, the Falls Coalition, and Otterbein University to produce a public service announcement on fall prevention. The Infrastructure Committee is currently working on an assessment for the Falls Coalition to be distributed in the fall. Mount Carmel is looking for a location 60 miles outside Franklin County to conduct a Tai Chi coaches training in the Spring of 2015.
- **Prescription Drug Action Group (PDAAG)** –Geneva Sanford reported for the PDAAG. The Drug Enforcement Agency will offer the drug take backs on September 27th individuals can contact local law enforcement for locations. The policy group has been working toward removal of the pre-certification in Medicaid for Naloxone, Medicaid reimbursement for the atomizer, and billing services for Project Dawn. House Bill 363 introduced this will grant immunity to those who seek or obtain medical assistance for self or another person who is experiencing a medical emergency as a result of ingesting drugs or alcohol or for a person who is experiencing

such a medical emergency and for whom medical assistance is sought. Working toward a mandate for prescribers to utilize OARRS. Promoting usage of OARRS in the Emergency Department Setting. The Education Group for the Public is working on material for the risks and benefits of prescription drugs and drug take backs and drop boxes. The Education Group for Health Care Providers is working with Steven O'Neil for train the trainer for SBIRT. Working on a Pain Management Guidelines Curriculum for Residents. In Youngstown have been training dental providers. A hospital survey will be conducted on implementation of prescribing guidelines. House Bill 170 passed and Naloxone can now be prescribed to third parties. Continued training of law enforcement to administer Naloxone. Working toward allowing Pharmacists prescribing Naloxone and physicians issuing standing orders for Naloxone. ODH will receive information on the Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) cases from the Ohio Hospital Association (OHA). Infrastructure Action Groups

- **Injury Prevention Policy and Advocacy (IPPAAG)** – Donna Dickman advised the group the Advocacy Day at the Statehouse was April 14th and the group did hand out policy guides (<https://sites.google.com/site/ippaag/>); however, the group learned Wednesday was not a good day and to not engage legislators during annual budget reviews. The action group will offer the following webinars by Diane Pickles: Fundraising, Grassroots and Key Contacts, And Decision Maker Advocacy. The Advocacy Boot Camp will be held in March of 2015.
- **Evidence Based Injury Prevention (EBIPAG)** – Mitchell Briant reported that the EBIPAG is cooperation with the CIAG in plan a one day teaching conference on injury prevention and evidence based measures with Dr. Fowler and Dr. Gielen from John Hopkins on November 7th. The meeting time today will be work groups for the logistics of the conference. Lara McKenzie will also be presenting at the main meeting today on Evidence Based Injury Prevention and Research. The EBIPAG continues to work on the fact sheets for Teen Driving and Falls.
- **Data Action Group (DAG)**- reported that the DAG meeting was held in June at OCOSH had presentations from be Alan Wedd on Ohio Incident Based Reporting System (OIBRS) and Sara Lowe for the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS). The next meeting is September 18th location to be determined and will highlight traffic crash data and results. Mbabazi Kariissa will present the results of the data survey conducted with the membership. Some of the highlights include what data is useful, data training requested, how often data resources are referenced, and formalizing the data process request.

Advisory Committees

- **Membership and Outreach** –Judi Mosley reported the committee now has 8 members and will be selecting a chair for the committee. The group will begin to establish recruitment strategies for the OIPP. The OIPP has 62 new members since January and new membership orientation continues to have good attendance.

VIPP Update

- Christy advised that Katie Stevenson was hired as the new ISS Coordinator. Still working to fill the Injury Policy Specialist (Cameron's position). A new Human Services Program Consultant will be hired to assist with Prescription Drug Overdose in working with training and providing technical assistance to sites.
- Funding will be utilized for to have a health care provider organization assist at a State level in promoting the STEADI Toolkit and provide data from implementation.
- Working with Evidence Based Prevention with Teen Driving by adding an education component for parents when the teen driver is receiving license/permit. Looking to pilot at a Bureau of Motor Vehicle (BMV) site.
- VIPP participated in the re-competing Federal grant funding for the National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS) and were awarded funding at an increased amount which will allow the program to be fully staffed. Congratulations to Jolene and her staff.
- Christy informed the Leadership Team she is leaving ODH in the beginning of October to relocate to another State. Thanked everyone on the Leadership Team for the time, contributions, expertise and leadership to the

OIPP since 2007. Thanked everyone for assisting with the OIPP and the actions groups over the years. She stated she would visit each action group to thank them and say good bye.

OIPP Member Survey

- Christy shared it had been about 4 years since feedback from the membership was received and the member survey is being updated and will be sent between the August and November meeting.
- The results could be shared at the November meeting along with recommendations for 2015.

OIPP Champion and Promising Practice Awards

Christy shared about the OIPP Champion and Promising Practice Awards.

- The applications for the OIPP Champion and Promising Practice Awards will be distributed in the next few weeks.
- The awards will be presented at the November 14th Annual Meeting.
- It is important for the leadership team to promote and encourage individuals to nominate individuals for these awards.
