OIPP Leadership Team Update: Nicole Hodges

- Currently reviewing and planning to update the Strategic Plan for the OIPP.
- Also reviewing Bylaws for possible update.
- The Evidence Based Group will have a new focus to include professional development and capacity building for the OIPP.
- Through the mentorship program 8 mentees completed an application. 6 have been placed with a mentor. We still have two mentees in need of placement within the focus area of Child Injury if anyone is interested in acting as a Mentor please contact Pam Rudolph.
- The OIPP renewal and reminders have been sent to the membership. 235 members renewed and there are 20 outstanding who still need to renew. If you have not renewed please do so your name will be removed to our inactive status. At that point you will not receive communications from the OIPP.
- Meeting times will remain 10 to 3 with an hour lunch.

Violence and Injury Prevention Program (VIPP) Update: Jolene Defiore-Hyrmer

- **Organizational Update-** The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) is currently in an organizational process. The work completed by VIPP will continue and will be located in the Bureau of Health Promotion.
- **Subgrantees-** The 10 subgrantees were refunded through the Preventative Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG). The subgrantees received additional funding for expanded Policy, Systems, and Environmental Change Strategies.

- **Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB)**-ODH has completed the PHAB site visit for accreditation. Much of the documentation utilized was from the work of the OIPP and the action groups.
- **Funding**-The Ohio budget continues to identify infant mortality as a priority for the State of Ohio. This priority will assist ODH with funding to continue to work with Infant Safe Sleep. The Federal budget continued the PHHSBG and identified additional funding to focus on prescription drug overdose at a state and local level.
- **Safe States Alliance**-The Safe States Alliance membership will participate in a public education day and educate members of the United States Congress about violence and injury prevention programs.
- **Injury Priorities**-VIPP has submitted request for proposals (RFP) to the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) for partners to assist with our injury priorities. RFP's include implementation of the Stopping Elderly Accidents, Deaths, and Injuries (STEADI) Tool Kit into health care practices and a partner to provide technical assistance and identify best practices for Naloxone. Once released by DAS the members of OIPP will be notified.

Infrastructure-Level Groups

Data Action Group (DAG)-Mbabazi Kariisa

- December 18, 2014 meeting had two speakers covering the topics of the Statewide Automatic Child Welfare System (SWACIS) and Human Trafficking.
- The March 19, 2015 meeting will be from 1 pm to 2:30 and Laura Potts will provide information on the Multi-Agency Community Information Systems (MACIS) and a presentation on the Ohio Hospital Association (OPHA) data.

Evidence-based Injury Prevention Action Group (EBIPAG)-Pam Rudolph

- After the member survey and leadership team meeting it was determined the focus of the EBIPAG will be shifted to professional development and capacity building for injury prevention efforts statewide.
- EBIPAG and the Membership Action Group will be combined.
- This will allow the group to have the following subcommittees: Professional Development, Member Communications, and Member Outreach.
- Today the action group will determine an appropriate name, subcommittee chairs, and goals for each subcommittee.

Injury Prevention Policy and Advocacy Action Group (IPPAAG)-Sara Morman

- The Ohio Injury Prevention Partnership (OIPP) Policy and Advocacy Action Group is offering a Power Prism Webinar series with Diane Pickles from M+R Strategic Services. Power Prism is a step-by-step advocacy framework for recognizing and acting on opportunities to build momentum in an advocacy campaign. Priority Injury Action Groups Annual Reports

Prescription Drug Abuse Action Group (PDAAG)-Judi Mosley

- Eight new members have joined the PDAGG.
- The PDAGG completed a survey and will review today at the meeting. The membership it indicated satisfaction with the PDAGG and its' direction.
- Today under facilitation of Lois Hall the PDAAG will complete a strategic planning session. Some items for discussion will be educating professionals on prescription drug abuse and overdose, promoting the prescribing guidelines, expanding Project Dawn and access to Naloxone, and permanent drug take back.
- There are currently 22 Project Dawn sites operating and 17 in development.
- Legislation pending includes Pharmacists prescribing Naloxone, having standing orders for Naloxone, and the "good Samaritan" law.

Child Injury Action Group (CIAG) – Amanda Kelley

- The CIAG has established a Facebook page.
- The Strategic Action Plans were completed between meetings and will be shared with the entire CIAG today.
- The CIAG has selected chairs for each of the subgroups as follows:
 - Wheeled Sports-Amy Campbell
 - Traumatic Brain Injury-Heather Trnka
 - Child Passenger Safety-Emily Lee
 - Teen Driving-Ann Smith
 - Infant Safe Sleep-Lori Consondine and Sherry Black
- The CIAG received 25 applications for the mini-grants. The grants will be reviewed in February and the notice of awards provided in March. The CIAG will award \$36,000.
- The CIAG printed concussion cards for distribution among sports leagues. The card provides information about concussion signs and symptoms as well as Ohio's Return to Play Law. Please see attached electronic card. Any questions please contact Amanda Kelly by email at kellya@starkhealth.org

Ohio Older Adults Falls Prevention Coalition- Brenda Rock

- The Ohio Department of Aging (ODA) has a campaign for older adults for fall prevention called "Win Winter" which addresses the risk factors and steps for prevention for winter weather. The information is available at <http://www.aging.ohio.gov/steadyu/>
- ODA with their STEADY U is promoting to business owners a "Let's Go Steady" campaign to encourage them to fall proof their sites.
- The promotion sub-committee has been working toward planning the statewide conference for Falls Prevention which will be held in October or November and will feature the Stopping Elderly Accidents, Death, and Injuries (STEADI) Tool Kit. With the assistance of Dr. Joe Rosenthal The Ohio State University will co-sponsor the conference.
- The infrastructure subcommittee will release the mini-grants for fall prevention on February 20, 2015 for seven projects up to \$5000 each for policy, systems, and environmental change strategies to implement the STEADI Tool Kit, develop a home modification system, or build an infrastructure for Tai Chi. The application is available at <http://www.healthy.ohio.gov/en/vipp/oafpc/oafpc.aspx> under "What's New." The grants applications are due March 31, 2015 and notice of award will be announced on April 30, 2015.

- The policy subcommittee will begin exploring opportunities to partner with insurance companies to provide coverage for mobility and exercise interventions such as Tai Chi.
- The Coalition has established a Facebook page.

Membership /Outreach Action Group-Judi Mosley

- The Membership/Outreach Action Group will be merging with the newly formed Professional Development and Capacity Building Action Group (PROCAP).
- 20 members joined through the OIPP application, 22 became first time members through the 2015 Renewal Application, and 13 members resigned. The OIPP has seen a net gain of 29 members since the November 2014 Annual Meeting.
