

## Questions Asked on the 11/26/2014 Conference Call on Central Coordination

**1. How will the CCC be funded in SFY16?**

*ODH has not yet arrived at an allocation methodology at this time but we will in the next few weeks. We will take into account the total number of referrals received by the CCC. We are not sure if there will be a minimum amount allocated per county, like there was this year. There are also conversations at ODH about how the carryover funds should or should not factor into a SFY 2016 allocation for CCC and a decision has not yet been made regarding these carryover funds.*

**2. Will all 88 counties be funded?**

*Yes, all counties will be funded, though we are still encouraging multi-county coordination.*

**3. If 2 counties merge, will money be combined into 1 contract?**

*Each county will have their own allocation and they can decide if they want one combined payment or separate payments to each county. One contract is easier to manage both at the state and locally because there is only one set of deliverables to meet for the multi-county region with one contract.*

**4. When you talk about multi-county coordination, are you talking about the small counties only?**

*At first we thought only the small counties would want to do this, but it may also be beneficial for the larger counties to coordinate with their neighbors. We do not have any expectations or predictions about who will or will not collaborate for the upcoming year, but we are eager to see.*

**5. Where do you get the number of referrals that come into the CCCs?**

*We get our data from Early Track*

**6. Will there be more reports in ET to help us?**

*Yes, please submit any suggestions for reports that you have to your consultants.*

**7. Will ODH ever require regionalization?**

*The CCC workgroup recommended that ODH not force counties to regionalize. They recommended that we give the CCCs time, guidance and clear expectations about operating a HMG central coordination. It is not our plan to impose a regional central coordination at this time, but I also cannot and will not try and predict the future.*

**8. Is it okay if I add local data to the tool kit?**

*Yes, this tool kit was created so that you can use it in whichever way makes sense and works for you to use to start the process.*

**9. Our county is thinking of partnering with Healthy Moms and Babies.**

*That is a wonderful idea. Not all counties have that program so it's a great idea to work with them at the county level.*

**10. What about other states? What are they doing/saying?**

*Advantages include less confusion for families; one stop shop for early childhood programs in the state; maximized consistency because fewer people are delivering the message; and a statewide system of supports and services.*

**11. Is there a projected date for the allocation table?**

*We are meeting Monday, Dec 1<sup>st</sup> to discuss the allocations. The table should be going out to the counties sometime during the month of December.*
