Footnotes

SPP/APR Indicator

This field refers to a specific outcome reported to the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) as part of the State Performance Plan (SPP) and Annual Performance Report (APR).

County Performance

This field provides the **actual performance** of the local county program.

Statewide Performance

This field provides the **actual performance** of the entire state.

Statewide Target

This field shows the **performance goal** established for the state in the SPP/APR where a (1) indicates a compliance indicator and a (2) indicates a performance indicator. The U.S. Department of Education established a target of 100% for compliance indicators. For performance indicators, the State of Ohio established a statewide target in the original SPP submitted to the Department of Education in December 2005.

NOTE

For each of the indicators, **NA** denotes an item as "Not Applicable". "Not Applicable" indicators are items for which there are no data. For indicators 3a, 3b, and 3c, county level data is not reported due to having a minimal number of child records with the required data.
