Hancock County Early Intervention is determined as **Needs Assistance** for the second consecutive year.

APR Indicator Description and Results

The U.S. Department of Education established a target of 100% for compliance indicators. Ohio established statewide targets for performance indicators in the original State Performance Plan (SPP) submitted to the U.S. Department of Education’s Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) in December 2005. The following tables provide a summary of the state’s as well as your county’s results for each compliance and performance indicator. These data are considered to be preliminary, and are subject to change based upon feedback from OSEP regarding the Ohio APR. For each of the indicators, N/A denotes an item as “Not Applicable”, meaning there were no data for that indicator.

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Data Summary – Compliance Indicators

- **45 Day:** Referred between September 3, 2012 and November 16, 2012
- **TRS:** All IFSPs with new services listed from June 1, 2012 to August 31, 2012
- **IFSPs with Steps:** Self-assessment data for children who had a TPC due between January 1, 2013 and March 31, 2013
- **Notification to LEA:** Reports submitted to ODH for children who would be turning three between February 1, 2013 and January 31, 2014
- **TPC:** Children who were due to turn three years of age between April 1, 2013 and June 29, 2013

Note: Ohio has chosen to use a three-year monitoring cycle for analyses of the compliance indicators. HMG EI programs were selected to be included in the analysis for one of the three indicators in SFY11, another in SFY12, and the last in SFY13. Hancock County was selected for the 45-Day analysis for SFY13.

Data Summary – Performance Indicators

- **Settings:** Infants or toddlers primarily receiving services in the home or community-based settings from the December 1, 2012 child count
- **Child Outcomes:** Scores from Entry and Exit COSFs of children who exited between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013 regarding those who (1) substantially increased their growth or (2) exited at age expectations in relation to (a) positive social-emotional skills, (b) acquiring and using knowledge and skills, and (c) taking appropriate actions to meet their needs.
- **Family Outcomes:** Scores of respondent families who were being served in Early Intervention on May 1, 2013 who report that early intervention services have helped the family (a) know their rights, (b) communicate their children’s needs, (c) help their children develop and learn.
- **Birth to 1 Child Count:** Compared to the 2010 population estimate
- **Birth to 3 Child Count:** Compared to the 2010 population estimate
